Preserving the history of education for blacks in Amelia has been the focus of the Russell Grove Association since its inception in 1984. The Association membership spans the school's four decades and provides educational scholarships, mentoring programs and activities, including class and school reunions.

Russell Grove Schools became a beacon of light and a model of achievement and educational excellence. The renovated former black high school at 8701 Otterburn Road now houses the Russell Grove Museum, community meeting rooms and the school board offices.

In the years following the Civil War, one and two room schools, providing elementary education for blacks, slowly dotted the county's landscape. The black community worked feverishly to establish secondary education for black students, and strategically maneuvered behind the scenes to erect the Russell Grove High School in 1933.

The school, first located in the old Chapel of the Russell Grove Presbyterian Church, currently Zion Hill Presbyterian Church, was closed in 1969 when Amelia County Public Schools were completely desegregated.
